The Highway 72 tract is an excellent opportunity for a buyer looking for a turnkey hunting property with high quality deer and turkey hunting and productive wing shooting as well. A very well-maintained logging road runs through the interior of the property for 2/3 of a mile providing easy access to the ±100 acres north of the CSX rail line. The lower 40 is accessed through two locked gates in the Sumter National Forest. The deer and turkey populations are truly impressive for a property this size in the SC piedmont. The landowner's attention to detail with regards to best wildlife management practices combined with a diverse habitat (different age classes of loblolly, upland hardwoods, natural wetlands, privet thickets along Duncan Creek, and 10+ acres of planted food plots) has produced tremendous results. The food plots have been complemented with mast tree planting as well and 12 quality deer stands are in place and convey with the property (along with three 200 lb gravity feeders and a tractor with 8 implements).



USDA-NRCS IN GEORGIA ANNOUNCES SIGN-UP FOR CONSERVATION EASEMENTS PROGRAM

ATHENS, GA — State Conservationist Terrance O. Rudolph, for the USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) in Georgia, today announced a sign-up for the Agricultural Conservation Easement Program (ACEP) for fiscal year 2024. To be considered for the upcoming fiscal year's funding pool, applications must be submitted by October 6, 2023.

The ACEP, created through the 2014 Farm Bill and reauthorized in the 2018 Farm Bill, is a program that has two components, known as Agricultural Land Easements (ALE) and Wetlands Reserve Easements (WRE).

"ACEP is a great way for landowners and eligible entities to conserve, restore and

protect our nation's wetlands, productive agricultural lands and grasslands," said Rudolph. "NRCS is proud to work alongside our customers that have allowed us to become the largest easement holder and steward in the nation."

ACEP-WRE applications are accepted directly from producers on eligible lands. These easements will restore and enhance wetlands and improve habitat. Eligible lands include farmed, prior converted or forested wetlands that can be successfully and cost-effectively restored. Applications will be ranked according to the easement's potential for protecting and enhancing habitat for migratory birds, fish, and other wildlife.

Applications for the ACEP-ALE are accepted from eligible entities only. These eligible entities may submit proposals to NRCS to acquire a conservation easement on eligible agricultural land. NRCS does not accept applications for ACEP-ALE directly from producers. Producers will need to work with an eligible entity to pursue funding for an ACEP-ALE conservation easement. Some examples of eligible entities include Land Trusts and Land Conservancies. Land types that could be eligible for ACEP-ALE include cropland, rangeland, grassland, pastureland and nonindustrial private forestland with prime and statewide important soils.

All applications must be submitted to Georgia NRCS by October 6, 2023, for both ACEP-ALE (from the eligible entity) and ACEP-WRE (from producers with eligible wetlands). Conservation program applications are available at your local USDA Service Center and at our Application and Forms web page.

SCDNR OFFERS PUBLIC SURVEY, VIDEO PRESENTATION ON DECLINING WILD TURKEY NUMBERS

The South Carolina Department of Natural Resources has heard from turkey hunters, landowners and members of the General Assembly with concerns about decreasing turkey numbers and declining harvests across the state.

These issues are not unique to South Carolina and are occurring across much of the Southeast. SCDNR shares these concerns and reproductive data, harvest data and numerous research projects in South Carolina and across the region support these observations.

In response to this issue, SCDNR recently hosted five public meetings around the state to discuss declines in wild turkey numbers and options to address these declines. At these meetings, SCDNR presented data and received comments and questions from almost 300 hunters.

SCDNR does not set seasons, bag limits or hunting methods. Input from the public, combined with survey and monitoring data and university research findings will be used to develop recommendations for the S.C. General Assembly should they elect to move forward with legislative proposals related to wild turkeys. Any potential changes would occur no sooner than the 2024 legislative session and would not go into effect until the spring of 2025, at the earliest.

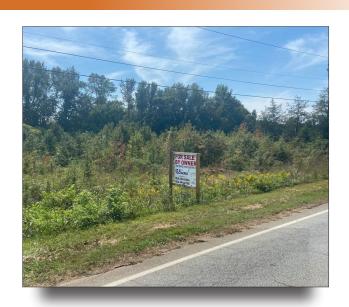

DOVE PIZZA ON THE GREEN EGG

Ingredients:

- 1-2 Rolls of pizza dough
- 3-4 Cups of BBQ sauce
- 1 Red onion
- 1 Bell pepper
- 5-6 Cups Cheddar & Mozzarella Cheese
- 2 Jalapeno peppers
- 10-12 Dove breasts (or duck)

Cornmeal

Directions:

BOIL dove breasts until meat is browned then pull the meat into shreds.

MIX in 1 cup of BBQ sauce to pulled meat.

FLATTEN pizza dough and cook for 2-3 minutes each side at 375 degrees (make sure to spread plenty of cornmeal on the pizza stone to prevent the dough from sticking).

REMOVE cooked crust off the green egg and add pulled dove (or duck) meat.

SPREAD 2-3 cups of BBQ sauce, chopped onion, bell pepper, and jalapeno peppers and top with cheese. Put the pizza back on the green egg (use more cornmeal!!) and cook for another 25-30 minutes at 350 degrees.
